

## **Gary Jeandron Receives Endorsement from California Republican Assembly**

Palm Springs, CA - - Republican Gary Jeandron, candidate to replace Chad Mayes in the 42nd Assembly District, received the endorsement from the California Republican Assembly (CRA) last night (2-17-18) in Temecula.
